Hazrati Imam Complex

Immerse yourself in Central Asia's most colorful market. Marvel at pyramids of spices, dried fruits, nuts, and watch traditional bread-making in tandoor ovens.

Traditional Uzbek restaurant serving lagman noodles, manti dumplings, and fresh salads.

Tashkent Metro Tour

Ride the spectacular Soviet-era metro, each station a unique palace featuring chandeliers, marble, and Central Asian motifs. Visit Alisher Navoi, Kosmonavtlar, and Amir Timur stations.

Amir Timur Square & Independence Square

Photo stops at Tashkent's main squares showcasing post-independence monuments and Soviet-era grandiosity.

Minor Mosque Visit

Admire the stunning white marble Minor Mosque with its elegant dome and minarets.

Day 18: Hazrati Imam Complex

Day 19: Drive to Tajikistan Border (Jartepa/Sarazm)

Scenic 4-hour drive through fertile valleys and mountain foothills. Your guide will brief you on border procedures.

Day 20: Drive to First Lake (Mijgon)

Scenic 1.5-hour drive climbing into Fann Mountains. Pass through traditional Tajik villages with apricot orchards.

Day 21: Return to Uzbekistan Border

Drive back to Jartepa/Sarazm border crossing.

Day 22: Gur-Emir Mausoleum

Visit the tomb of Amir Timur (Tamerlane), founder of the Timurid Empire. Stunning blue ribbed dome and golden interior. See the massive jade tombstone.

Day 23: Drive to Bukhara

Scenic 4-hour drive through desert landscapes. Option to stop at ancient caravanserai ruins along historic Silk Road route.

Day 24: Ark Fortress

Explore the massive citadel that was home to Bukhara's emirs for over a millennium. Walk the ramparts, visit throne room, and museum.

Day 25: Desert Drive to Khiva (7 hours)

Cross the spectacular Kyzylkum Desert ("Red Sand") via M37 highway. Stop at Amu Darya River (ancient Oxus River of Alexander the Great). Pass through oasis towns, desert stretches, and cotton fields. Your guide shares Silk Road history.

Day 26: Kalta Minor Minaret

Marvel at the massive turquoise-tiled minaret, intended to be tallest in Central Asia but never completed. Perfect photo opportunity.

Day 27: Drive to Shavat-Dashoguz Border

Transfer from Khiva to Uzbekistan-Turkmenistan border (approximately 60 km, 1 hour).

Day 28: Independence Park

Visit Ashgabat's crown jewel park with fountains, monuments, and massive Arch of Neutrality.

Day 29: Camp Breakfast

Simple but hearty breakfast: bread, cheese, tea, eggs. Pack up camp.

Day 30: Nissa Fortress (UNESCO Site)

Visit the 3rd century BC ruins of ancient Parthian capital, just 18km from Ashgabat. See remains of palaces, temples, and the famous Parthian Rhytons (drinking horns) discovery site.

Day 31: Cross to Tajikistan - Penjikent & Ancient Sogdiana

Today marks your first international border crossing! Drive through scenic mountains to the Uzbekistan-Tajikistan border at JarTEpa/Sarazm. After crossing, explore the ancient ruins of Penjikent, known as the "Pompeii of Central Asia," dating back to the 5th-8th centuries.

Hearty breakfast before border crossing. Pack essentials in day bag for easy border processing.

Drive to Tajikistan Border (JarTEpa/Sarazm)

Scenic 4-hour drive through fertile valleys and mountain foothills. Your guide will brief you on border procedures.

Border Crossing Formalities

Exit Uzbekistan and enter Tajikistan. Process typically takes 1-2 hours. Keep passport and visa documents ready.

Welcome to Tajikistan! Drive to Penjikent

Short 30-minute drive to Penjikent, an ancient Sogdian city. Check into guesthouse.

Lunch at Local Penjikent Restaurant

Try Tajik specialties like qurutob (bread with yogurt sauce) and osh (Tajik-style plov).

Ancient Penjikent Ruins Tour

Day 36: Border Crossing (Tajikistan to Uzbekistan)

Exit Tajikistan, re-enter Uzbekistan. Usually faster on return journey.

Day 37: Shah-i-Zinda Necropolis

Walk through this breathtaking "street of tombs" - 11 mausoleums connected by azure-tiled passageways. Each tomb showcases unique tilework patterns. Climb 36 steps (count them!) and count again on return for local legend.

Day 38: Arrival & Hotel Check-in

Check into boutique hotel in Bukhara's old town - many hotels are converted madrasahs or merchant houses.

Day 39: Bolo Hauz Mosque

Admire the elegant wooden pillars and painted ceiling of this 18th-century mosque, still active for Friday prayers.

Day 40: Lunch Stop in Roadside Café

Simple but tasty meal at highway café - experience real Uzbek roadside culture!

Day 41: Kunya Ark Citadel

Explore the Khan's fortress with throne room, harem, mint, and jail. Climb to battlements for panoramic city views.

Day 42: Border Crossing to Turkmenistan

Cross from Uzbekistan (Shavat) to Turkmenistan (Dashoguz). Thorough customs inspection - be patient. With our LOI support, process is smooth. Allow 2-3 hours. Welcome to Turkmenistan!

Day 43: Turkmenbashi Mosque

Tour one of Central Asia's largest mosques, built of white marble with gold domes. See the mausoleum of Turkmenistan's first president.

Day 44: Drive to Mary City (4-5 hours)

Long desert drive to Mary, Turkmenistan's fourth-largest city. Pass through more Karakum Desert, occasional oases, and gas fields.

Day 45: Tolkuchka Bazaar Visit

Experience Central Asia's largest bazaar (open Wed, Sat, Sun). Find traditional Turkmen carpets, silver jewelry, embroidered hats, and handicrafts. Perfect for final souvenirs.

Day 46: Seven Lakes of Tajikistan - Fann Mountains Paradise

One of the tour's absolute highlights! Journey into the stunning Fann Mountains to visit the legendary Seven Lakes (Haftkul/Marguzor Lakes), each more beautiful than the last. Turquoise waters surrounded by dramatic peaks create unforgettable photographic opportunities.

Drive to First Lake (Mijgon)

Scenic 1.5-hour drive climbing into Fann Mountains. Pass through traditional Tajik villages with apricot orchards.

Lake 1: Mijgon (Lowest Lake)

First of the seven cascading lakes. Deep blue waters at 1,640m elevation. Photo stop and short walk.

Lakes 2-3: Soya & Hushyor

Continue upward visiting Soya Lake (known for color variations) and Hushyor Lake (one of the largest). Short hikes along shores.

Lakes 4-5: Nofin & Khurdak

Visit the smallest but charming Nofin Lake surrounded by willows, and medium-sized Khurdak Lake with mountain backdrop.

Lakeside Picnic Lunch

Traditional Tajik lunch with fresh bread, cheese, vegetables, fruits, and tea. Enjoy mountain serenity.

Lake 6: Marguzor (Largest Lake)

The largest and most spectacular lake. Optional 30-minute hike to viewpoint for panoramic photos.

Lake 7: Hazorchashma (Highest Lake)

The final lake at 2,400m elevation. "Hazorchashma" means "thousand springs" - fed by numerous mountain streams. Most remote and pristine.

Return Drive to Penjikent

Descend from mountains as sun sets, golden light illuminating peaks. Arrive back at guesthouse.

Day 47: Welcome Dinner at Afsona Restaurant

Enjoy authentic Uzbek cuisine including plov (national dish), samsa, shashlik, and fresh bread. Perfect introduction to Central Asian flavors.

Day 48: Lunch at Besh Qozon

Traditional Uzbek restaurant serving lagman noodles, manti dumplings, and fresh salads.

Day 49: Welcome to Tajikistan! Drive to Penjikent

Short 30-minute drive to Penjikent, an ancient Sogdian city. Check into guesthouse.

Day 50: Lakes 2-3: Soya & Hushyor

Continue upward visiting Soya Lake (known for color variations) and Hushyor Lake (one of the largest). Short hikes along shores.

Day 52: Bibi-Khanym Mosque

Explore the massive ruins of Timur's grand mosque, once the largest in Central Asia. Walk through the enormous main portal and courtyard.

Day 53: Lunch at Chinar Restaurant

Welcome to Bukhara with local specialties. Try Bukhara-style plov (different from Samarkand style).

Day 54: Trading Domes Tour

Walk through three preserved trading domes where Silk Road merchants sold hats, money exchange, and jewelry. Now filled with craft shops - perfect for authentic souvenirs.

Day 55: Arrival in Khiva

First glimpse of Khiva's mud-brick walls rising from desert. Check into hotel inside or near Ichan-Kala fortress.

Day 56: Juma Mosque (Friday Mosque)

Walk through the unique "forest of columns" - 212 carved wooden pillars supporting the roof of this 10th-century mosque.

Day 57: Lunch in Dashoguz

First Turkmen meal! Try chorba (soup) and fitchi (spinach-filled pastry).

Day 58: National Museum of Turkmenistan

Explore Turkmenistan's history from ancient times through Soviet era to independence. See the famous Akhal-Teke horse exhibits.

Day 59: Lunch in Mary

Local restaurant in Mary city.

Day 60: Farewell Lunch at Ashgabat Restaurant

Final group meal together. Share highlights and exchange contact information with fellow travelers. Traditional Turkmen feast.

Day 61: Return to Uzbekistan - Samarkand, Jewel of the Silk Road

Bid farewell to Tajikistan and cross back into Uzbekistan. Drive to legendary Samarkand, one of the world's oldest continuously inhabited cities. This afternoon, witness the breathtaking Registan Square at sunset - the most iconic view in all of Central Asia.

Return to Uzbekistan Border

Drive back to Jartepa/Sarazm border crossing.

Hidden courtyard restaurant serving refined Bukharan cuisine.

Day 69: Evening Walk in Ichan-Kala

Take your first magical walk through Khiva's inner city as evening light turns mud bricks golden. Marvel at minarets silhouetted against sunset. Orientation for tomorrow's full tour.

Day 70: Islam Khoja Minaret & Madrasah

Climb Khiva's tallest minaret (45 meters) for spectacular bird's-eye views of the entire fortress city and surrounding desert.

Day 71: Flight to Ashgabat

Domestic flight from Dashoguz to Ashgabat (approximately 1.5 hours). Fly over Karakum Desert.

Day 72: Lunch at Local Restaurant

Turkmen cuisine with rice pilaf, shashlik, and ishlekli (meat pie).

Day 73: Ancient Merv Tour - Erk Gala

Begin at Erk Gala, the oldest part (6th century BC). Walk atop massive earthen walls of the original fortified settlement.

Day 74: Airport Transfer

Private transfer to Ashgabat International Airport. Your guide assists with check-in and bids farewell.

Afrosiab Museum

Learn about ancient Samarkand (formerly Afrosiab) through archeological artifacts. See the famous 7th-century Sogdian frescoes.

Traditional Bread Workshop

Visit family bakery to watch tandoor bread-making. Try your hand at shaping dough and decorating with traditional stamps. Take home fresh hot bread!

Day 76: Amir Timur Square & Independence Square

Photo stops at Tashkent's main squares showcasing post-independence monuments and Soviet-era grandiosity.

Day 77: Ancient Penjikent Ruins Tour

Explore the remarkably preserved 5th-8th century Sogdian city ruins. See residential areas, bazaar, temples, and fortress walls. Your guide brings this "Pompeii of Central Asia" to life.

Day 78: Lakeside Picnic Lunch

Day 83: Lunch at Zarafshon Restaurant

Traditional Khivan cuisine in atmospheric old building.

Day 84: Arrival in Ashgabat

Transfer from airport to hotel. First glimpses of the white marble city - utterly unlike anywhere else on Earth.

Day 85: Drive to Darvaza Crater (5 hours)

Epic journey into Karakum Desert. Roads get rougher as you leave civilization. Stop at small villages, see desert landscapes, watch for camels. Your guide explains the crater's fascinating formation story.

Day 86: Gyaur-Kala Fortress

Explore the 4th century BC fortress, Merv's second incarnation. See remains of Buddhist stupa and Zoroastrian fire temple.

Day 87: Departure

Depart Turkmenistan with incredible memories of three countries, countless UNESCO sites, new friends, and the adventure of a lifetime. Safe travels home!

Day 88: Samarkand to Bukhara - Silk Road Journey

Travel from Samarkand to Bukhara, another UNESCO Silk Road jewel. Arrive in time for an atmospheric evening walk through Bukhara's old town, where merchant caravans once rested and traded exotic goods from China to Europe.

Day 94: Sitorai Mokhi-Khosa Palace

Tour the last Emir's summer palace combining Russian and Oriental architecture. See the harem quarters and beautiful gardens.

Day 95: Tash Hauli Palace

Tour the "Stone Courtyard" palace with incredible tilework, exploring the reception courtyard, harem courtyard, and court yard. Each more ornate than the last.

Day 96: Evening Drive Through Modern Ashgabat

Orientation drive past illuminated marble buildings, golden statues, and massive monuments. See the famous "Gate of Neutrality."

Day 97: Arrival at Darvaza Gas Crater - Sunset

As sun sets, approach the crater. First view is breathtaking - a 70-meter wide burning pit in the desert. The roar of flames, intense heat, and surreal orange glow create otherworldly atmosphere.

Day 98: Sultan Sanjar Mausoleum

Visit the iconic 12th-century mausoleum with its massive corrugated dome. Once visible for miles across the desert, guiding caravans to the city.

Day 99: Bukhara Full Day - The Noble Bukhara

Spend a full day exploring Bukhara, Central Asia's best-preserved medieval city. From the ancient Ark Fortress to the trading domes where merchants bartered for centuries, every street tells stories of the Great Silk Road.

AFTERNOON:

Breakfast at Hotel

Enjoy breakfast in atmospheric old town setting.

Ark Fortress

Explore the massive citadel that was home to Bukhara's emirs for over a millennium. Walk the ramparts, visit throne room, and museum.

Bolo Hauz Mosque

Admire the elegant wooden pillars and painted ceiling of this 18th-century mosque, still active for Friday prayers.

Trading Domes Tour

Walk through three preserved trading domes where Silk Road merchants sold hats, money exchange, and jewelry. Now filled with craft shops - perfect for authentic souvenirs.

Lunch at Minzifa Restaurant

Hidden courtyard restaurant serving refined Bukharan cuisine.

Chor Minor ("Four Minarets")

Visit this quirky gatehouse with four distinctive blue-domed towers. One of Bukhara's most photographed sights.

Sitorai Mokhi-Khosa Palace

Tour the last Emir's summer palace combining Russian and Oriental architecture. See the harem quarters and beautiful gardens.

Bahauddin Naqshband Complex

Visit the mausoleum and mosque of Bahauddin Naqshband, founder of the influential Naqshbandi Sufi order. Important pilgrimage site.

Day 100: Lake 7: Hazorchashma (Highest Lake)

The final lake at 2,400m elevation. "Hazorchashma" means "thousand springs" - fed by numerous mountain streams. Most remote and pristine.

Day 101: Siab Bazaar Evening Visit

Quick stop at Samarkand's main bazaar for evening shopping - dried fruits, spices, local bread.

Day 102: Traditional Bread Workshop

Visit family bakery to watch tandoor bread-making. Try your hand at shaping dough and decorating with traditional stamps. Take home fresh hot bread!

Day 103: Bahauddin Naqshband Complex

Visit the mausoleum and mosque of Bahauddin Naqshband, founder of the influential Naqshbandi Sufi order. Important pilgrimage site.

Day 104: Pakhlavan Mahmud Mausoleum

Visit Khiva's most sacred site, the mausoleum of the 14th-century poet-philosopher-wrestler. Stunning blue and white tilework.

Day 105: Campfire Dinner Under Stars

Traditional Turkmen dinner cooked over fire: shashlik, bread, vegetables, tea. Sit on carpets eating dinner with the crater's glow illuminating the night.

Day 106: Large and Small Gyz Gala

See these mysterious Seljuk-era structures with unique corrugated walls. Their original purpose still debated by archaeologists.

Day 107: Desert Journey to Khiva - Through Kyzylkum

Embark on an epic desert drive across the legendary Kyzylkum Desert following ancient caravan routes. Watch landscapes change from oases to pure desert. Arrive at Khiva, an incredibly preserved fortress city that feels like stepping into an illustrated fairy tale.

AFTERNOON:

Hearty breakfast before long but fascinating drive. Pack snacks and water.

Desert Drive to Khiva (7 hours)

Cross the spectacular Kyzylkum Desert ("Red Sand") via M37 highway. Stop at Amu Darya River (ancient Oxus River of Alexander the Great). Pass through oasis towns, desert stretches, and cotton fields. Your guide shares Silk Road history.

Lunch Stop in Roadside Café

Simple but tasty meal at highway café - experience real Uzbek roadside culture!

Arrival in Khiva

First glimpse of Khiva's mud-brick walls rising from desert. Check into hotel inside or near Ichan-Kala fortress.

Evening Walk in Ichan-Kala

Take your first magical walk through Khiva's inner city as evening light turns mud bricks golden. Marvel at minarets silhouetted against sunset. Orientation for tomorrow's full tour.

Day 108: Return Drive to Penjikent

Descend from mountains as sun sets, golden light illuminating peaks. Arrive back at guesthouse.

Lunch at Zarafshon Restaurant

Traditional Khivan cuisine in atmospheric old building.

The adventure of a lifetime! Morning tour of Ashgabat's marble monuments, then drive into the Karakum Desert to witness one of Earth's most dramatic sights: the Darvaza Gas Crater, burning continuously since 1971. Camp under the stars next to this inferno - an experience you'll never forget.

Wake early to see the crater in morning light. Different but equally spectacular. Final photos at this incredible site.

Camp Breakfast

Drive to Mary City (4-5 hours)

Long desert drive to Mary, Turkmenistan's fourth-largest city. Pass through more Karakum Desert, occasional oases, and gas fields.

Keshk Fortress

Drive to Ashgabat (4 hours)

Farewell Lunch at Ashgabat Restaurant

Final group meal together. Share highlights and exchange contact information with fellow travelers. Traditional Turkmen feast.

Airport Transfer

Private transfer to Ashgabat International Airport. Your guide assists with check-in and bids farewell.
